The National Association of Boards of Pharmacy (NABP) released it data on Friday on the most recent North American Pharmacist Licensure Examination® (NAPLEX) passing rates for 2022 graduates. CU Pharmacy graduates did exceedingly well, with a first-time pass rate of 96%. Only two other schools had higher scores, with CU Pharmacy tied for third highest in North America.


